North Central Missouri Development Alliance.



March 20 - Cameron






Jordan Wright took the lead as "Head Goose" for the day, with excellent support from the

Scholarships Awarded to High School Graduates

Now in its second year, the scholarship program has expanded to provide two \$1,000 awards—doubling its previous impact and reaffirming the organization's commitment to empowering young leaders through education.
